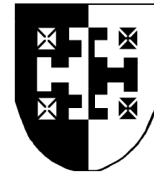
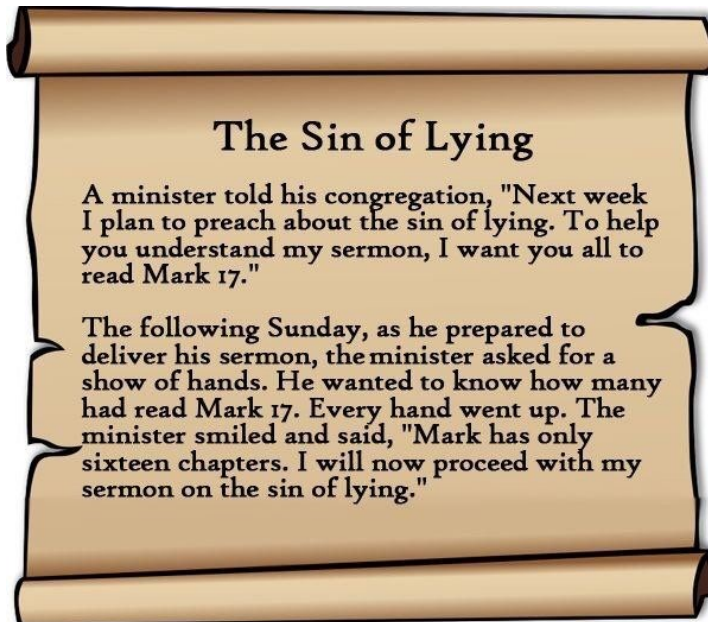

**INTRODUCTION**

Waitangi Day has been a significant day on New Zealand's calendar since the Treaty of Waitangi was first signed in 1840. On 5<sup>th</sup> February of that year a marquee was erected in front of the home of the British resident, James Busby. Captain William Hobson presented a proposal for the attending chiefs to agree to British settlement in New Zealand. The chiefs vigorously debated the proposed Treaty through the day with some rangatira supporting it and others opposed to it. Discussions continued that night across the Waitangi River at what is now Te Tii Marae. The next day over 40 signed the Maori version of the document, now known as Te Tiriti o Waitangi. By September 1840 over 500 leaders from throughout the country had signed the document.

**We have moved to services under ‘Traffic Light Red’** which requires each person to show a Vaccine Pass in order to attend a service. Most aspects of our services remain as they have under Level 2: mask wearing in the service, only bread at communion, no offertory taken during the service (the collection plate is at the back of the church for you to put in your gift to support the Church), and appropriate distancing. However we can now have morning tea in our usual manner without having to be served at the table.

**We have introduced** a communion service on Wednesday afternoons at 1pm at St Ambrose at which vaccine passes will not be required to be shown. The Transitional Cathedral is also offering service at 12:15pm on Sundays that does not require the showing of a vaccine pass.

**Recently a donation of garden soil** was received from Phil Mauger. It was made to enable repairs to the garden beds at St Ambrose after completion of all the earthquake repairs. A very generous donation and much appreciated. Rev Felicity is looking to organise a working bee to make progress on restoring the garden to a relatively maintenance-free state.

**Today is also AAW Sunday**—we remember and honour all those past and present members of the Association of Anglican Women, the work they do and the fellowship they provide.
