We'll always remember "Lisbeth's" sense of humor and her beautiful smile

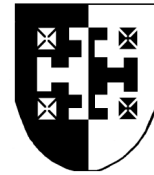

INTRODUCTION

Jesus told his disciples to pray continuously and never lose heart. Why is prayer important? It clarifies our hope and our intentions. It helps us to discern between the important and the trivial. It teaches us what to aspire to and implants in us the ideals we ought to cherish. But prayer is no substitute for action. Prayer is like a beam thrown from a flashlight before us into the darkness – it helps us to go forward, and encourages us to act.
