History of Mothering Sunday

Most Sundays in the year churchgoers in England worship at their nearest parish or 'daughter church'.

Centuries ago it was considered important for people to return to their home or 'mother' church once a year. So each year in the middle of Lent, everyone would visit their 'mother' church - the main church or cathedral of the area.

Inevitably the return to the 'mother' church became an occasion for family reunions when children who were working away returned home. (It was quite common in those days for children to leave home for work once they were ten years old.)

And most historians think that it was the return to the 'Mother' church which led to the tradition of children, particularly those working as domestic servants, or as apprentices, being given the day off to visit their mother and family.

As they walked along the country lanes, children would pick wild flowers or violets to take to church or give to their mother as a small gift.

INTRODUCTION

Mothering Sunday is traditionally a day when the church gives thanks for mothers. It stands out as a day of joy and celebration in Lent which is a season of austerity. In this context, the gospel reading for today, with its prophecy of suffering to come for both Jesus and his mother, seems both harsh and out of place. Mothers, though, may think differently. The experience of bearing and bringing up children is not all sweetness and light. It involves mental as well as physical pain. There is a cost to caring which this gospel highlights, and which today's feast invites us to consider. Furthermore the image of the Church as a mother can help us to see beyond the human organisation which too easily becomes an end in itself. The Church is the means by which Christ supports and nourishes us in our faith.
