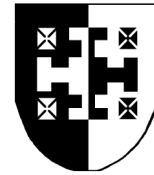
Notices (con't):

INTRODUCTION

Jesus' desert experience came at a crucial time in his life. As a result of it he grew to love solitude, and made a habit of seeking it at difficult moments in his life. When people and events threatened to engulf him, he would withdraw to a lonely place to recover and rededicate himself to the mission God had given him. We too need the 'desert' experience, a place for reflection. We need solitude. In solitude we begin to stand on our feet before God and the world, and accept full responsibility for our own lives. In solitude we can recover and rededicate ourselves to our God-given mission.
