INTRODUCTION

Our first reading comes from the Book of Exodus. After their long journey through the wilderness, the Israelites have reached Mount Sinai. The time has come for a fresh start with God, and Moses ascends Mount Sinai, where he receives the Ten Commandments from God. The first three commandments speak of the relationship between God and people; the other seven of how relationships play out in the life of the community. God gives guidance for living a God-centred life rather than a self-absorbed one. The Ten Commandments give us a framework for living, to grow up to be fully human, like Jesus: loving and compassionate.
