INTRODUCTION

From Bishop Peter:

This coming **Sunday, 8 February 2026** is **Epiphany 5**. The Gospel reading is **Matthew 5:13-20**. There are at least three significant Sunday messages to be brought out of this passage: being salt of the earth; being light to the world; being righteous in the context of the Law of Moses and the teaching of Jesus as it reinterprets that Law.

Let's continue in prayer for the troubled places of the world, including Iran (which has gone somewhat quiet in the news, but great trouble continues there). The **Anglican Missions Board page** offers guidance on praying the **news about Iran**.

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent is two weeks away, Wednesday 18 February 2025. I commend ministry units organising ecumenical services for Ash Wednesday and look forward to joining in our annual Roman Catholic – Anglican cathedrals' ecumenical service which will be in **St. Mary's Pro Cathedral, Manchester Street, Christchurch at 5.30pm**.
