INTRODUCTION

From Bishop Peter:

This **Sunday, 7 December 2025** is **Advent 2.** The epistle reading is **Romans 15:4-13**. This is a deep passage, bookended by the theme of "hope", with our hope in God grounded in the coming of Christ into the world as a fulfilment of past hope – that the promises of God to the patriarchs would one day come to be realised. The work of God in Christ is for the world, for you and me, for Jew and Gentile, in other words, for everyone, that all are welcomed into the enduring family of God.

The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news.

St Ambrose Day - 7 December

Ambrose was born in 339. He became Bishop of Milan by popular choice in 374 when, as governor of the city, he intervened to stop riots over the election of the bishop. Ambrose did much to deepen the theology of the western church on the full divinity of Christ. In his defence of the church's independence from the state, he did much to shape church-state relations in western Europe. He had no hesitation in rebuking the Christian emperor when necessary. Ambrose died in 397.

The sentence of the day for St Ambrose is most appropriate for the work done at our St Ambrose site:

Defend the weak and the orphaned; maintain the cause of the afflicted and destitute. Rescue the weak and needy and save them from the hands of the wicked. *Psalm 82: 3, 4*
