The Bible Readings for today - 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jeremiah 1: 4-10 Hebrews 12: 18-29 Luke 13: 10-17

INTRODUCTION

Jeremiah 1:4-10 "A Prophet to the Nations" – Jeremiah was called by God at a tender moment in Israel's history when it lost its independence and was ultimately exiled to Babylon. Resistant to God's call, Jeremiah highlights that he is only a boy so how could he possibly know what to say as a prophet to the nations? God, however, tells Jeremiah that he has always been with him since his very beginning and that he will be with him as says hard things to his people.

Hebrews 12:18-29 "Coming to the City of the Living God" – The early church was small, fledgling, and persecuted, and it was also trying to define itself. This passage juxtaposes the 'new' covenant of Jesus, the Christ, with the 'old' covenant as part of defining their identity. The passage highlights the awesomeness and fearsomeness of God's voice and uses the metaphor of *fire* for God, both in discussing Sinai and the City of God.

Luke 13:10-17 "Jesus Heals on the Sabbath" – Healing is an important part of Jesus' ministry of salvation, but it is not his healing ministry that creates friction in this story. Jesus' healing of a woman on the Sabbath causes the leader of the synagogue to protest that there are six days available for work and the seventh is a day of rest (Deut. 5:12-15). Still, throughout Luke's Gospel, Jesus is healing on the Sabbath (Lk. 4:39; 6:6-11; 13:10-17; 14:3-6). Each time, a leader tries to call him out on it, and each time Jesus poses the question back: Is it better to do harm or good on the Sabbath? How do you think we Christian's are doing in observing our Lord's resurrection day (Sunday) as a holy day of worship and rest?
