INTRODUCTION

In the Gospel Reading Jesus asks his disciples: What do you want or What are you looking for? It is a simple question, but profound. Maybe even life-changing. The Son of God looks at his first would-be followers, and asks them to consider what it is that they are really looking for. It is, when you stop and think about it, one of the most important questions that we can ever ask ourselves. And it is, I believe, the question that Jesus asks of all his would-be followers. What are you looking for?

We often don't stop and ask ourselves this question. We rush through life, meeting the day's needs, dealing with the thousand things this world throws at us, and rarely slow down enough to consider this question. And when we don't stop and ask ourselves this question, we run the risk of being like the person who spent a whole life climbing the proverbial ladder, only to discover that the ladder was leaning against the wrong wall. What are we looking for? Is our ladder on the right wall?
