The Bible Readings for today - 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jeremiah 2: 4-13 Hebrews 13: 1-8, 15-16 Luke 14: 1, 7-14

INTRODUCTION

Jeremiah 2:4-13 "Israel Forsakes The Lord" – Jeremiah was a prophet in the nation of Judah from the thirteenth year of King Josiah (627 BCE) until the Babylonian exile in 580 BCE. In today's reading Jeremiah invites all the families of Israel to remember that they are a people of the exodus, of wilderness wanderings, and of a land flowing with milk and honey. Why? Because the LORD says that his people 'have forsaken' him, 'the fountain of living water, and dug out cisterns for themselves, cracked cisterns that can hold no water' (Jer. 2:13).

Hebrews 13:1-8, 15-16 "God Is With Us" – The author of Hebrews encourages believers to act on the basis of mutual love, remembering those in prison, or those being tortured, and offering strangers in their midst hospitality. Their love for others, however, is not based on what they might gain but on the assurance of God's faithfulness and the example of Christ's self-giving and sacrificial love for them.

Luke 14:1, 7-14 "Invite The Poor To Your Banquet" — In this passage Jesus teaches about the nature of true hospitality. He urged dinner guests not to trouble themselves with vying for places of honour. He also told his listeners that when they host dinners, they were not to invite guests who can reciprocate their invitation. Instead, he encouraged them to invite those who cannot pay them back. Then as now, Jesus' teaching calls for radical changes not only in what we do but also in how we think of others and ourselves.

Sentence

'All who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.'

Luke 14:11

Collect

Lord, help us to see: to see what is eternally good and true, and having seen, to go on searching until we come to the joys of heaven; for the glory of your holy name. Amen.
